You will learn from experts how perpetrators capitalize on the victim's emotional vulnerabilities through false hope of love and companionship, all while conducting financial warfare leaving victims grappling with significant financial losses and emotional trauma.

By attending this one-day course you will equip yourself to help the public, your agency and your loved ones with the tools needed to protect the community from this heinous crime. You will learn the details of how this scam works, and how law enforcement and prosecutors work to combat it.

This course is designed for all ranks of peace officers and police chiefs, including patrol, investigator, desk operations, crime analysts, public information, and community outreach.
