Law enforcement officers are frequently called upon to manage incidents involving people with mental illness. This interactive training will cover mental illness, stigma, substance use disorders, developmental disabilities, and more. The class will also feature a guest speaker, someone living with a mental illness who will share his experiences.

This training satisfies Senate Bill 29 (SB29), requiring all Field Training Officers (FTOs) to have at least 8 hours of crisis intervention behavioral health training.

Topics will include:

- Stigma and the damaging effects it can have
- Deinstitutionalization
- Bipolar disorder, schizophrenia & other psychotic disorders
- Substance use disorders
- Intellectual disability, signs, and symptoms
- Crisis intervention and guidelines for intervention
- Effective de-escalation techniques
- Resources on how to better serve individuals of this nature
