It covers the use of video to document intake, interviews and debriefings, contraband concealment, assaults, injuries, and altercations.

Students learn to record evidence-grade video of contraband searches in cells, vehicles, and residences, as well as medical and post-altercation exams. Students also learn day and night video surveillance of static and moving subjects. Safe recording of cell rushes is also demonstrated in this course.
