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COURSE OVERVIEW

Surveillance at night? Surveillance from a mile away? No problem!

Investigators learn to record video surveillance in difficult conditions: nighttime and from extreme ranges.

Participants learn how to effectively record evidence-grade surveillance video at distances greater than two miles using long-range lenses for DSLR and mirrorless cameras and camcorder digital zoom capabilities.

Students will then learn four different ways they can possibly use their cameras in low-light and no-light conditions. They will also see demonstration video from both low-cost and high-end night recording devices and learn how to use infrared lights and beacons as tools for night surveillance and investigator safety.
