VR Tactics, Use of Force, and Law (VRTUL)

Who:	For POST certified peace officers
What:	<p>The LAPD Virtual Reality Tactics, Use of Force, and Law course (POST course #21196 CURR:T300) is an eight hour training that satisfies the POST Use of Force and Strategic Communication PSP requirements. Students will experience the training through the state-of-the-art arena scale Virtual Reality Training System located at historic Elysian Park Police Academy. The system, provided by V-Armed, allows for up to ten students to enter a 100 ft x 50 ft virtual space simultaneously and be confronted by complicated use of force scenarios. They will confront both computer-controlled suspect and role player suspects, victims, and witnesses. The VR experiences are paired with rich after action debriefs conducted by use of force experts harnessing the power of the debrief software which shows students where they moved, what they said, what type of force they used, the effectiveness of the force, and accuracy including accountability for all hits and misses. The course also includes coverage of federal case law and California state law using the student's VR experiences to connect law to their actions in the field.</p>
