Search Warrants Demystified: A Practical Approach to Search Warrants Monday, May 19, 2025 0900-1700 Dublin, CA

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Description: This course will incorporate a case study of the investigation and prosecution of a double "no body" homicide by the San Pablo Police Department which involved the service of over 80 search warrants, including "sneak and peek" search warrant, and overcoming the challenges of searching massive quantities of digital evidence produced by those search warrants.

INSTRUCTOR(S):

Mary Knox has been a Contra Costa County prosecutor for 40 years. She has supervised the Homicide Unit and the Community Violence Reduction Unit supporting the former DA/FBI Safe Streets Task Force. Mary has provided search warrant instruction to law enforcement agencies throughout the state, teaching for HIDTA, CNOA, the Robert Presley ICI Narcotics Investigators Course, and the DOJ/ATC Computer and Digital Recovery Course.

Alfredo Rodriguez began his law enforcement career in 2014 with the Contra Costa County Sheriff's Office, where he served in several specialty positions, which included Resident Deputy for the Bayo Vista (Rodeo) Housing Authority, Training Staff, and SWAT. In 2019, Alfredo lateralled to the San Pablo Police Department, and he is currently assigned to the Investigations Unit, where he is assigned to the Sexual Assault and Homicide Unit.
