Investigations, Intelligence, and Criminal Activity

LIVE ONLINE TRAINING

This course is designed to enhance the Dark Web skills of investigators. The course will cover various topics, including a refresher and update on accessing and navigating the Dark Web, identifying Dark Web marketplaces and forums, and conducting anonymous or undercover operations. Officers will also learn how to use specialized tools and software for Dark Web investigations, including TOR, VPNs, virtual machines and “bridges.” They will learn how to analyze Dark Web data and identify patterns and trends, as well as how to gather intelligence and track down criminals. By the end of the course, students will be equipped with the necessary skills and knowledge to effectively combat criminal activity on the Dark Web.

Course Topics Include:

- Structure and functioning of the Dark Web
- Tools and software to navigate the Dark Web
- Dark Web marketplaces and forums hosting criminal activity
- Dark Web undercover operations
- Dark Web data analysis to identify patterns and trends
- Collaboration with other agencies and organizations to gather intelligence about Dark Web activities
- Ethical and legal considerations of Dark Web investigations
- Combating criminal activity on the Dark Web
